## Discussion Questions for The Hiding Place by Corrie Ten Boom

Overall, did you like the book and if so why?

What advice did the father give Corrie about the train case? About what she thought was her intended?

Corrie is interviewed by the Lieutenant and asks "What else is in that book." What was her response? Are we prepared to answer in sharing our faith?

What did you think about Corrie's sister, Nollie who couldn't lie when they had people hiding in a place under the table? Is it ever ok to tell a white lie/lie?

What ways did you feel like you were in Holland? And during the war?

Can you relate to Corrie's bravery and her mission?

What characters stood out to you and why?

What did you think about how Corrie's sister Betsie handled their time in prison/concentration camp thinking of the conditions and their treatment by the gaurds. An example:

"If people can be taught to hate, they can be taught to love. We must find a way, not matter how long it takes. I saw a gray uniform and a visored hat; Betsie saw a wounded human being."

What are the Christian themes of this book?

How is the name of the book comes to light, where is the Hiding place?

What Bible verses inspired you or maybe you saw in a new light?

Did you read Corrie's timeline at end of book? Were there any surprises in there?
